#### Happy Friday Everyone!

My theme this week is one of safety and in particular online safety. Keeping all of our children safe is central to everything we as a school and you as parents do. I am concerned by the rise in reports of cyber bullying amongst our children. Many parents have approached me with concerns that their child has been on the receiving end of unkind words and messages. We teach and model online safety in school and in particularly throughout our computing and Learning4Life curriculum and, whilst I am confident our children are aware and know how to keep themselves safe on the internet, all of the reported incidents take place out of school hours and – worryingly - on messaging platforms that are 13 years plus. That of course means that none of our children should be using these platforms.

Whilst I am aware that the world of instant messaging has become the preferred communication of choice, at the risk of seeming old fashioned I feel the impersonal nature of Whats App and Snapchat has led to many people saying things online that they might not say to someone's face. That being considered and the fact that both Whats App and Snapchat are 13 plus I wonder whether we should take time to think about the wisdom of our children using them?

To help you be more vigilant and make an informed choice I have included two sets of guidelines lower down in this flyer: one for Whats App and one for Snapchat. Please do take a look and discuss them with your children. In doing this you will be supporting us in ensuring your child is safe.


Well done to all the children who participated. They represented the school brilliantly.

#### SAFETY AT THE START AND END OF THE DAY



Congratulations to Birch Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 253 points. Well done Birch Class!





WHAT ARE THE RISKS? With more than two billion active users, WhatsApp is the world's most popular messaging service, its end-to-end encryption only allows messages to be viewed by the sender and any recipients; not even WhatsApp itself can read them. The UK's Online Safey Bill proposes to end such encryption on private messaging, but for the time being this controversial feature remains.

#### EVOLVING SCAMS

WhatsApp's popularity makes it e incrative hunting ground for scammers. Recent examples include posing as the target's child, requesting a money transfer because of a spurious 'emergency' – plus a scam where traudsters trigger a verification message by attempting to log in to your account, then (posing as WhatsApp' call or text to ask you to repeat the code back to them, giving them access.

## CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

To start a chat, someone only needs the mobile number of the WhatsApp user that they want to message. Therefore, if a child has ever given their number out to someone they don't know, that person could then centact them via WhatsApp, it's also passible that the child might be added to a group chat or community (by one of their hiends, for example) containing other people that they don't know.

#### CHAT LOCK

In 2023, WhatsApp introduced a feature that lets users keep their chats in a separate 'tacked chats' folder, saved behind their phone's passcode, fingerprint or face ID authentication. They subsequently developed an additional feature – 'Secret Code' – where users set a unique password for their locked chats. Unfortunately, this function creates the potential for young people to hide conversions and content they suspect their parents wouldn't approve of (such as age-inappropriate material).

#### **COMMUNITIES AND GROUPS**

A community is a collection of related groups on WhatsApp. They can consist of thousands of users. Continuities can enfers be used by scammers to target large groups, hoping someone clicks on their link or responds to their requests. In communities and groups, there are multiple ongoing conversations, which results in pressure to respond. Members—even if they are not each other's contacts—will be able to see any messages sent into the group.

## VIEW ONCE CONTENT

The ability to send images or messages that can only be viewed once has led to some Whats tipp users sharing inappropriate material or abusive texts, knowing that the recipient can't re-open them later to use as evidence of misconduct. People used to be able to screenshot this disappearing content-but a recently added Whats tipp feature now blocks this, citing protection of privacy.

#### FAKE NEWS

WhatsApp's connectivity and ease of use allows news to be shared rapidly – whether it's true or not. To combat the spread of misinformation, messages forwarded more than five times on the app now display a "Forwarded many times" label and a dauble arrow icon. This makes users aware that the message they've just received is far from an original ... and might not be entirely factual, either.

#### VISIBLE LOCATION

WhatsApp's 'live location' feature lets users share their current whereabouts, which can be helpful for friends meeting up or parents checking that their child is safe while out, for example. However, anyone in a user's contacts list or in a mutual group chat ca also track their location – potentially letting strangers identify a child's home address or journeys that they make regularly.

## Advice for Parents & Educators

#### ADJUST THE SETTINGS

Additionally, if a child no step verification adds a further layer of section to their WhatsApp account.

#### **DISCUSS GROUP CHATS**

Make children aware that there could be members of a group that they don't know well and that words can be misinterpreted. Encourage them to leave a good impression, to avoid joining it if conversations turn towards bullying, and to respond to such situations in an appropriate way. Make sure they know that it's OK to leave a group chat if it makes them uncomfortable – or for any reason, in fact.

#### THINK BEFORE SHARING

EMPHASISE CAUTION

Help children understand why it's important to stop and think before posting or forwarding something on WhatsApp. It's easy – and all too common – for content the a user posts to be shared more widely, even publicly on social media. Incourage children to consider how an impulsive message or forwarding might damage their

#### CHAT ABOUT PRIVACY

Check in with the child about how they're using WhatsApp, making sure they know you only have their adlety of heart. If you spot a 'Locked Chutefolder, you might want to talk about the sort of content they've stored in there, who they're talking to, and why they want to keep these chats hidden. Also, if children send any 'view once' content, it could be helpful to ask them why.






## OF RESTRICTION

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Snapchat is a messaging app which allows users to send images, videos and texts to others. Its best-known feature is that anything sent 'disappears' 24 hours after it's been viewed; however, users are known to take screenshots or use another device to obtain a photo of their screen. In 2023, Snapchat added a chatbot function called 'My Al'.

#### SCAMS AND BLACKMAIL

Predators can exploit Snapchat's disappearing messages feature by, for example, telling a user they have naked photos of them (regardless of whether it is true or not) and will share them online unless they send them money. Teens then (understandably) panic and worry about the long-term consequences. Snapchat's own research found that 65% of teenagers had experienced this – either on this app or others.



Snapchat works hard on user engagement, with features like streaks (messaging the same person every day to build up a high score). The app also has sections called 'Discover' and 'Spotlight'. It claims the content shown here is relevant to each user, but it could also be seen as an easy way to hook users into watching videos endiessly. Furthermore,

#### INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Same content on Snapchat simply inn't suitable for children. The hashtags used to group content are determined by the poster, so even an innocent search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's 'disappearing messages' feature also makes it easy for young people to share explicit images on impulse—so sexting continues to be a risk associated with Snapchat.

#### ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

My Al is Snapchat's new chatbot, which replies to questions in a human-like manner. However, the software is still in its infancy and has significant drawbacks, such as biased, incorrect or misleading responses. There have already been numerous reports of young users turning to Al for medical help and diagnoses, which could be inaccurate and therefore potentially dangerous.

#### **ONLINE PRESSURES**

Although many of Snapchat's filters are designed to entertain or amuse, the 'beautity' effects on photos can set unrealistic body image expectations creating feelings of inadequacy if a young person compares themselves unfavourably with other users. Snapchat new also has 'priority' notifications (which still get displayed even if a device is in 'do not disturb' mode), increasing the pressure on users to log back in and interact.

#### VISIBLE LOCATION

A feature called 'SnapMaps'
highlights your device's exact
position on a virtual map, which is
visible to other users. There are
options to restrict who can see this
information: all friends, selected
friends or just you. Snapchat also has
real-time location sharing, which is
intended as a buddy system to help
friends keep track of each other – but it
could also be used to track a young
person for more sinister reasons.

## Advice for Parents & Educators

#NOFILTER

#### SET CONTROLS VIA FAMILY CENTRE

Snapchat has parental controls called "Family Centre". You must invite a child to the Family Centre for them to join. This allows you to view their triends list, see who they have chatted with in the last 7 days (but not to view the specific messages) and report any

#### KEEP ACCOUNTS PRIVATE

Snap Stories are visible to everyone a ser adds unless they change their settings. On naphiaps, their location is visible unless abost dade is enabled. It's safest for a child to avoid adding people they don't know in real life – sspecially since the addition of My Places, which allows people to see where users regularly visit.

#### DISCUSS AI

Although My Al's responses can often give the impression that it's a real person, it's essential that young people remember this certainly isn't the case. Encourage children to think critically about My Al's replies to their questions: are they accurate and reliable? Remind them that My Al shouldn't replace chatting with their real friends, and that it's always better to talk to an actual person in relation to medical motters.

#### CHAT ABOUT CONTENT

it may feel like an awkward conversation (and one that young people can be reluctant to have) but it's important to talk openly and non-judgementally about sexting. Remind children that once something's online, the creater loses control over where it ends up — and who else sees it. Likewise, it's vital that children understand that some 'challenges' which become popular on the platform may have harmful consequences.

#### BE READY TO BLOCK AND REPORT

If a stranger does connect with a child en Snapchat and begins to make them feel uncomfortable through bullying, pressure to send explicit images or by sending sexual images to them, the child can select the three dots on that person's profile and report or block them. There are options to state why they're reporting that user – such as annoying or malicious messages, spam or masquerading as someone else.

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





