Birch Class have been having a busy week and have continued to explore plants. This week they have been planting their own bulbs and exploring what a plant needs to grow.


SAFER INTERNET DAY – 11th FEBRUARY



Congratulations to Hazel Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with a staggering 416 points. Great job Hazel Class!




Rother House remain in the lead this week with 6018 points so far this year.


