There were 4 races; Year 3 and 4 girls, Year 3 and 4 boys, Year 5 and 6 girls and Year 5 and 6 boys. We got off to a very strong start with Darcy White winning the Year 3 and 4 girls' race. This winning streak continued with Baxter Phillips winning the Year 3 and 4 boys' race, Poppy Alden winning the Year 5 and 6 girls race and Harry Clark winning the Year 5 and 6 boys' race! Overall, we finished a close 2nd to a very strong team from Hollycomb. The Year 5 and 6 races were selection races where runners who finished in the top 6 were chosen to represent Central Sussex in the Sussex Cross Country finals in March. We had 3 runners selected for this; Poppy Alden, Frances Gooda and Harry Clark.

We are so proud of all our runners who showed real grit and determination. The sportsmanship they demonstrated was exemplary, encouraging each other and congratulating runners from other teams. Cross country is a tough sport and every single runner put in 100% and did themselves and our school proud, well-done team, you are amazing.

So, a plan was hatched and a recipe sought ... including meal worms; yuck! The group, who named themselves 'Duck Squad', started work devising and creating the mix and filling bags ready to feed the ducks and their new ducklings as we move into Spring.

It is hoped that the local community will get behind the

project by collecting the food bags from The Grange and help make sure the ducks get fed. Duck Squad sourced the bags and beautifully designed stickers so that it was clear to see that the children of MPS are keen to help our local wildlife and support where they can. We are very grateful to the staff at The Grange for supporting the project and to the South Pond Group for allowing us to do it. When you take a trip down to the pond, you will notice the beautifully designed poster that our competition winners, Zara and Masha from year 5, did which clearly say where to go and who the organisers are.

We are very proud of Duck Squad, their kindness and willingness to spend their hard-earned playtimes organising all of this. We hope this will be an ongoing project so, if you would like to contribute oats, seed, meal worms, dried vegetables, please see Mrs Mullen and she will arrange a place to bring donations. Jaxon,

one of the founder members of duck squad said "Being the leader of Duck squad made me feel happy and proud. It made coming to school easier and we are pleased to be improving duck health. It is important that people understand that bread is not good for ducks and we have helped with that".







HAZEL CLASS VISIT THE TITANIC EXHIBITION



On Wednesday, Hazel class went on a trip to the SeaCity Museum in Southampton to learn about the Titanic which is their topic in history this term. They took part in a workshop where they got to handle artefacts, carried out a science experiment, decided who they thought should have a place in the lifeboats and matched smells to room on the Titanic! They then did a self-guided tour of the museum following a trail and finally had a discovery tour where they were told stories of some of the passengers on board, tried their hand at Morse code and got to dress up. It was a fantastic trip, and we all came back full of facts and enthusiasm for the topic. The children were incredibly well-behaved and their listening and ability to ask and answer questions was commented on by the staff at the museum.









REMINDER TO BOOK BREAKFAST AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE





Congratulations to Pine Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 353 points. Great job Pine Class!




Rother House remain in the lead this week with 6344 points so far this year.

This week's overall attendance is 94.4%, slightly lower than our target of 95%.


